
The 2025 Great American Cleanup saw a 76% increase in volunteers from last year's 514 to 908 registrations. We typically only get this much traffic during our September cleanup, so this is a huge milestone. Through this jump in volunteers, the amount of trash bags filled and waste collected also increased by 82%, thus resulting in a more significant impact on our community.



































